CANINE CORNER

I need a consult please!

It was the Friday night before a holiday weekend. One of my dogs loves tennis balls and will play fetch for hours. She will slide on the hardwood floor sometimes when changing direction. Well on this night, she slid and went right into the wall. She got the ball of course but was then hobbling to bring it back to me. As I knelt down to look more closely I could see she had two broken toe nails. As a dog mom, what do I do? It's 9:30 pm and I am really not sure how much of an emergency this really is. Does she need to go to the vet? Does she need to go to the vet right away? Can it wait until morning? Until Tuesday? I would much prefer to go to my regular vet where they know me and know my dog rather than the more expensive emergency vet where the injury would be prioritized based on other emergencies. It could be a long night. I needed a veterinary consult of some sort.

If your dog is experiencing one of these signs, they need to see a veterinarian ASAP:

- 1. Straining to urinate or defecate This could be a sign of an obstruction of some sort and can lead to serious health issues. I laughed at a doctor once when he told me to get a urine sample from my female dog. That took some patience and creativity for sure but she was straining because of an infection so it was worth getting.
- 2. Fainting, sudden collapses, unconsciousness, disorientation, or seizures Some conditions are easily treatable, but it's very important to have it addressed right away. This can be scary but pay attention to your dog what is their body doing, what sounds are they making, what were they doing when the episode happened?
- 3. Weakness, inability to stand, wobbling, or dragging hind legs These could be a sign of the brain, spine, heart or lungs. PSA There is no need for your dog to ever be drunk or high. It's not funny. They don't understand what is happening to their body and that can be a dangerous situation.
- 4. Lack of appetite, repeated vomiting, diarrhea, not drinking water, or unproductive retching (or if you notice blood in the vomit or stool) These could be a sign that your dog has ingested something toxic, has contracted a virus or could be a sign of bloat. When the aren't acting like themselves, something is up. Don't ignore it.
- 5. Difficulty or labored breathing, choking, or nonstop coughing Breathing issues can be an indicator of a heart issue. Coughing could mean something is stuck in their trachea or a sign of kennel cough (which is contagious to other dogs). When a dog coughs, it sounds like they are trying to clear their throat. It's more like they are hacking something up rather than like a human cough.
- 6. Squinting, swollen eyes, bleeding from eyes, nose, or mouth Anytime you see blood, it's a pretty clear indicator that something serious is going on with your dog's health. Blood = Serious
- 7. Swollen limbs or limping Not the sympathy limp when they just jump off the bed wrong and milk it for all it's worth, we're talking limping for days and days. Swollen joints or limps that seem uncomfortable to your dog warrant a vet visit.
- 8. Whining, shaking, or restlessness without a reason Think of how they act when there's fireworks. If they are acting like this and there are no fireworks, something is going on and your dog is in pain or at least very uncomfortable.
- 9. Panting This is how dogs sweat. Are they anxious? Do they have a fever? Has their body temp gone up because of an internal injury and they are in pain?

These don't answer my questions about my dog's broken toenails. I do have an app on my phone called Petzey. Do yourself a favor and download it for free right now. It has saved me from unnecessary vet visits where I was just being a nervous dog mom. It's an app that allows you to video chat with a veterinarian for \$20. In my opinion it is worth \$20 to tell a trained professional the situation and have them make a recommendation. You only pay when you talk to someone. In this case, since the toenails were bleeding there was certainly a risk of infection and we went to the emergency vet that night. It was a \$400 pedicure but she's fully recovered and is back to playing fetch.

Here is a link to a number of emergency vet clinics/hospitals in New Jersey. I hope you never need to use it.

RECYCLING

Recycling Collection

Every other Tuesday | Place recycling at the curb the night before. See schedule below for details and exceptions.

Vegetative collection

Every other Thursday April-December | Vegetative Collection includes grass, leaves and brush. Place leaves and grass in biodegradable brown paper bags or open containers with handles. Keep brush separate from grass and leaves. Do not sweep leaves into the gutter or street. Branches or brush must be tied with string in bundles not to exceed 18 inches in diameter and 4 feet in length. No limbs or brush over 3 inches in diameter will be accepted. Collections should be at the curb the night before.
